Eric Ouellette, left, professional engineer and promoter of the giant dome igloo which made it into the Guinness World Records book this past winter, presented a plaque commemorating the event to Tobique-Mactaquac MP Mike Allen in recognition of his participation in taking the official measurements of the ice structure. These measurements were then submitted to the Guinness World Records organization which notified Ouellette on April 18 that the dome igloo, which took 2,000 blocks of ice and 50 hours to build, had established a new world record for the largest self-supporting dome igloo.
